

# How to apply:

Your registration fee is due April 1, 2010

Registration fee for single week: \$100.

Registration fee for multiple weeks: \$50 per week.

## Program pricing:

Full price for camp is \$215 per week

### Scholarship

The Schoolhouse is committed to maintaining diversity, including socio-economic diversity. Families may apply for a reduced rate by filling out the financial aid application. Financial aid is limited, so please apply early.

### Subsidy

Our summer camp accepts full and partial subsidies.

Families receiving a subsidy will need to pay the difference between their subsidy payment and the reduced fee of \$150 per week. Full payment is due at least 2 weeks before attendance.

## Requirements

### Campers

- Your child must have completed kindergarten and not yet started 6th grade to attend.
- All campers must bring their own lunch each day. Afternoon snacks will be provided.
- All campers must bring a change of clothes, towel, sunscreen and swim suit each week (please, no bikinis).

### Staff Aides

- Staff Aide applicants must have completed 6th grade and be 12 or 13 years old.

# Welcome

## to The Schoolhouse 2010 Summer Camp!

The Schoolhouse Learning Center is excited to present our first summer camp program. We have created 9 weeks of fun and educational activities for children in grades 1-5.

### A day camp with working parent hours!

Camp begins at 8:30 and ends at 5:30. Children will be divided into small, multi-age groups and assigned a camp counselor. Each group will spend the morning in theme related activities with short breaks. After lunch there will be a variety of enriching activities, with time for snacks, quiet time, and supervised, unstructured play until closing.

### Staff Aide opportunities for older kids

Children who have completed grade 6 are invited to apply for special, reduced-rate staff aide positions. They will attend all regular camp activities, have opportunities to practice leadership skills throughout the week and provide "counselor in training" services to the camp.

- 5:30 Camp closes

# Camp programs and dates:

## Artistic Opportunities

### Art & The Outdoors Camp

June 28 - July 2 & July 12 - 16

A perfect combination of artful activities, fun and the outdoors. Children will have opportunities to build fairy houses, add to the rock wall in front of the school, build rock sculptures, mud castles, bird nests, and make grass dolls.

### Multicultural Art

July 5 - 9 & July 26 - 30

Children will enjoy numerous hands-on activities designed to enrich their appreciation for cultures around the world. Activities mini-geography lessons, games, crafts, cooking and celebrations!

### Fiber Arts

August 2 - 6

Renowned Maine artist, Sue Drown from Sunfire Batiks will join us this week. Including: tie dye, batik, crown, bracelet and bag making. Bring your favorite shirt or jeans to embellish or paint.

### Everything Art Camp

August 16 - 20

This will be an art free-for-all! Building sculptures out of junk, art from recycled material, food as art, games with art and much more.



## Celebrating Superheroes

### Superheroes In Real Life!

July 19 - 23

A Schoolhouse twist on what it means to be a hero or a superhero. Children will engage in fun activities to learn about real-life heroes. They'll create comic books, magic wands and their own unique plans for saving the world. Non-violent, no weapons. (Cape's included!)

## Environmental exploration

### Wetlands & Nature Exploration

August 9 - 13 & August 23 - 27

Children will participate in hands-on exploration of the wetlands on site, create 3-D models of watersheds and wetlands ecology, and do science experiments. There will be time to make and float boats on the ponds, learn about outdoor survival and find out more about all the animals that make Schoolhouse's land their home in the summer.
